AIDS 2010 PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES

Working Group Terms of Reference

For Global Village (GV) and Youth Working Group Co-chairs and members

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of the working groups is to provide overall planning and guidance for the development of the GV and Youth programmes to take place at the XVIII International AIDS Conference in July 2010 in Vienna.

Each working group will comprise of working group members and two Co-chairs.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES

Working Group Co-chairs

- Represent their programme committees on the working group and report on their progress and initiatives during committee meetings
- Preside over their individual working group meetings
- Share responsibility for chairing the Programme Activity Planning Meeting (23-24 March 2009)
- Approve proposed external working group members
- Be spokespersons for their programme activity in collaboration with the Conference communications team

Working Group Members

- Develop key objectives for programme activities
- Develop criteria for the application, review and selection process
- Identify potential programming ideas and initiatives
- Nominate proposal reviewers
- Review submitted applications and participate in selection process
- Assist with resource identification and recommendations
- Provide on-going support in planning for the programme activity
- Act as liaisons between the working group and the wider community
- Prepare for working group meetings by reviewing meeting agendas and related documentation

3. COMPOSITION OF WORKING GROUPS

Global Village (n=11)

Governance:

- 2 x Co-Chairs (from Community Programme Committee)
- 2 x programme committee members - 1 from the Leadership Programme Committee (LPC), and the Scientific Programme Committee (SPC)
- 2 x international representatives
- 2 x regional reps (Eastern European and Central Asia)
- 2 x local reps
- 1 x working group member from the youth programme

NB. A member of the AIDS 2008 Global Village Working Group should be included on the AIDS 2010 Global Village Working Group to ensure the passing on of institutional memory.

One member should also have a strong background in HIV and cultural activities at the conference.

Support staff: GV Programme Coordinator (Conference Secretariat - Vienna)

Youth activities (n=9)

Governance:

- 1 x CPC member (to Co-chair, youth rep)
- 1 x LPC member (to Co-chair, youth rep)
- 1 x programme committee member (from the SPC)
- 2 x reps from international youth groups
- 1 x regional reps (Eastern European and Central Asia)
- 2 x local reps
- 1 x working group member from the GV programme (youth rep if possible)

NB. A member of the AIDS 2008 Youth Working Group should be included on the AIDS 2010 Youth Working Group to ensure the passing on of institutional memory.

As the working groups aim to be representative, membership will strive to be as diverse and equitable as possible in regards to gender, HIV status, age, ethno-cultural background, geographic and regional representation.

Support staff: Youth Programme Coordinator (Conference Secretariat - Vienna)

4. PLACE IN THE CONFERENCE STRUCTURE

The following is a description of the relationship between the working groups and other committees within the AIDS 2010 Conference planning structure:

- The Community Programme Committee (CPC) will provide on-going guidance, advice and support to the working groups;
- The co-chairs of the PA working groups serve as the final level of approval for contentious issues or decisions within the approved principles and framework.
- The Conference Coordinating Committee (CCC) serves as the final level of approval for contentious issues or decisions outside the approved principles and framework.

5. STAFF SUPPORT

The Conference Secretariat Staff will ensure on-going management, coordination and support for the working groups and for the implementation of the programme activities, including the application and review/selection process.

Each Working Group Coordinator will:

- a. Provide administrative support to the working group;

- b. Oversee proper endorsement/approval of working group decisions by relevant conference organizing bodies;
- c. Implement working group recommendations and decisions.

6. MEETINGS

Working groups will meet approximately 4 times from October 2009 – July 2010.

Meetings will occur in Vienna. In general, members not in Vienna at the time of the meeting will be connected by teleconference.

Active member involvement is important. Members are expected to participate in all meetings and to notify the Chairperson/Co-Chairs or the Working Group Coordinator at least one day in advance in case of their absence.

As a general rule, meeting agendas and related documentation will be distributed via email one week prior to working group meetings by the Working Group Coordinator.

7. DECISION MAKING

Quorum for decision-making purposes will be 50% of the working group membership and one chairperson.

Decisions will be made by consensus. If consensus is not possible, working members will agree on, and carry out, a process to deal with the issue.

8. RECORDING

Minutes summarizing issues raised and action items will be taken by the Working Group Coordinator and distributed by email to working group members following the meeting.

9. EXPECTED OUTPUTS

- Recommendations pertaining to:
 - Programme activity objectives
 - Potential programming ideas and initiatives;
 - Review and selection criteria
- Pool of proposal reviewers
- List of activities for the final programme
- Increased awareness of activities among professional networks
